2017 The End of the Year Summary and the Vision for the Future of our Parish in 2018

My fellow parishioners,

Now and then it is very important and at times even cathartic to look back and reflect on the accomplishments and the challenges which we faced as a parish community and as individuals. This State of Our Union Address will serve precisely such a purpose. I intend to summarize what had taken place at St. Joseph Parish during the last year and also share with you some plans and ideas for the future of our faith community.

The state of our union is strong. We have made our presence known in the City of Alliance by feeding the hungry, clothing the poor and reaching out to those who have fallen on difficult times. We visit our sick in various hospitals, nursing homes, and their own homes. We established a new parish ministry called the Guardian Angels. This ministry aims to assist our parishioners who may need help with grocery shopping, getting a ride to the doctor's office and other appointments, watching an infirmed loved one while the care giver takes care of other pressing issues and many other life situations that require help and assistance. Feel free to call the parish office regarding this new ministry and see if we can be of help to you or your loved ones.

As your pastor and spiritual leader, I dare to say that God has greatly blessed us during this past year. We have added many new and wonderful members to our parish family this past year. Some of our new members

came to us because they longed to find a loving and welcoming church community. Others decided to go through our RCIA program, and they became Catholic because here at St. Joseph in Alliance they found their one and true spiritual home. We have been adding new families and new members ever since I came here in 2011. As your pastor, nothing could make me happier than to see our parish grow in numbers and our love for God and His Church.

St. Joseph Parish in Alliance, Ohio is a beacon of hope for many people who live below the poverty level and who very often have been forgotten by our society. We extend our help and assistance through St. Vincent DePaul Society which operates on our parish premises and reaches out to all people in the Alliance community. Catholic or not, single or fami-

ly members we wish to help all people who are struggling during these difficult times. We do not wish to leave anyone behind. In any given year our parishioners give \$24,000 to St. Vincent DePaul Society and I wish to thank all of you who support this just cause from the bottom of my heart. Just like many of you I also make a monthly contribution to St. Vincent DePaul because I know that the needs of the poor and the hungry are numerous. We must never remain indifferent to the cries and pleas of those who struggle to make ends meet and suffer greatly in this life.

This past Christmas we delivered 65 Christmas baskets, and I personally visited several families and individuals in need of help who are not Catholic. True Christian love must be color blind, and it must be given freely and openly without any strings attached. Our God gives us His love and support simp-



ly because He loves us. As followers of Christ Jesus, we must do the same for others. Through your generosity we purchased a new (slightly used) St. Joseph Bus. I am very grateful to all people who made a donation towards this noble project. I also thank the Gatts and the King family members for driving the bus and bringing our parishioners to St. Joseph Church for our weekend Masses and other parish functions. This is a very important ministry of our parish and I thank God, each day that

This past year we put a new roof on our cemetery chapel and the cemetery maintenance building. We also placed new pipes and a new catch base around the

chapel because our old pipes collapsed and created a serious problem. We also opened a new section in our cemetery which was quite an ordeal since we had to pin all the new graves and mark them on our cemetery grounds and the cemetery map. We also purchased a new zero turn mower for the cemetery and a tractor with the snow removal and dirt removal attachment units. We would like to sell our old parish truck with the snow plow unit since we are no longer using it. If you know people, who might be interested in buying it, please, call our parish office and let us know.

We have been fixing the broken concrete on the side walks around the church and inside the courtyard. We also have been fixing the masonry walls around the church. It has not been an easy task but our head of maintenance, Dave Skolosh has been bound and determined to address these serious issues. It is because of his dedication and initiative that so many projects got accomplished and our cemetery always looks so beautiful. All of our maintenance guys are very dedicated individuals, and I applaud their hard work and commitment towards St. Joseph Parish. This past year I had an exchange of words with the Pokémon people who used to congregate at our cemetery and used it for playing games even when funerals were taking place. In no uncertain words, I expressed my disgust for disrespecting the resting place of our loved ones and for using our cemetery to play Pokémon games. Needless to say, the Pokémon people used all kinds of harsh and hateful words towards my person. May God forgive them for their arrogance and insults and have mercy on their souls. Remember that I am here to serve and to protect and I take my ministry of service with the outmost care and dedication.



One of the projects that has been in the making for the last two years is to build a larger garage/shed across from the Schwartz Center on Linden Street, so that we can store our tractor and other maintenance appliances. Mr. Dennis Clunk offered us a metal building structure free of charge as long as we can clear the existing space and make it ready for the new construction. It is my hope that we can make this improvement during this new 2018 year. Regarding our spiritual growth, we are looking at different programs trying to find one that will fit the needs of our adult parishioners to enhance their Catholic faith. Please, keep in mind that we are always in need of new Eucharis-

tic Ministers, Ushers, Lectors, Cantors, Altar Servers, Greeters, people who clean the church, PSR teachers and the folks who open the church and set up for Mass. Your willingness to help in any of these capacities is always greatly appreciated.

I wish to say a word of Thank You to our Music Director, Mr. John Zamarelli for his excellent choice of music and a beautiful Christmas Concert. It has been such a blessing to have at our church a very talented musician who works so efficiently and professionally with the parish pastor.



All in all, St. Joseph Catholic Church in Alliance, OH thrives and excels among many other churches – Catholic and non-Catholic. We are the face of Christ who came not to be served but to serve and die for all. We feed the hungry, we clothe the poor, we defend the unborn and those who have been used and abused by our society. 



EXPENSE


